John S. Ellis

Owen Rhoscomyl was a popular, influential and versatile pioneer of Anglo-Welsh writing. Exploiting his colourful past as a cowboy in the American west, international mercenary and hero of the Boer War, he became a minor celebrity and a well-known advocate of cultural nationalism in Edwardian Wales. Rejecting the nonconformist idea of the Welsh as a pacifist people, his exciting adventures spoke to many in 'imperial Wales' whose nationalism and imperialism were mutually compatible and supportive sentiments.

Cronica Walliae, Humphrey Llwyd's earliest and largest work, was completed in 1559. In his essay, Llwyd presents what he considered to be the true history of Wales to readers beyond its borders. Based on the medieval Welsh chronicle Brut y Tywysogyon, it is the first attempt to provide a history in English of the lives and acts of the kings and princes of Wales from Cadwaladr to the last native Welsh prince, Llywelyn ap Gruffudd.

The antiquary and map-maker **Humphrey Llwyd** was born in Denbigh c.1527 and educated at the University of Oxford. **Ieuan M. Williams** was Director of Extra-Mural Studies, and subsequently Chair of Adult and Continuing Education, at University of Wales College Swansea. The present edition of *Cronica Walliae* has been prepared for publication by **J. Beverley Smith**, Emeritus Professor of Welsh History at Aberystwyth University.
