Professor Charlotte Williams OBE and Dr Neil Evans as series editors are seeking to receive book proposals with a focus on race/ethnicity studies, which place Wales in a global context. Over a period of some forty years a considerable body of writing and research has been produced which details the place and reception of racial and ethnic minorities in Welsh society and which speaks more broadly to Wales's global encounters, past and present, including the relationship of Wales to slavery and empire. These social, economic and cultural connections shape Wales today.

Across a range of disciplines, the focus on race/ethnicity studies is growing, providing a basis for much needed comparative work and for engagement with the 'global turn' prevalent in many disciplines. This series aims to consolidate attention to this existing work and to stimulate new and emerging work in this field of study. The series is an exploration of the ways in which Wales has been and is being reshaped and reimagined through its racial and ethnic diversity. Proposals may come from any discipline and could focus on processes, policy or significant individuals relevant to Wales. This series aims to:

- Sustain and promote scholarship on race/ethnicity that enhances an understanding of Wales, its history, development and contemporary profile
- To promote multi-disciplinary research and publication in this field of study
- To provide works that are accessible to a broad public and available for cross-national comparison
