


Introducing the Medieval Dragon

This book is an introduction – as such its remit is to reach both the scholar and the interested lay reader and the key to appealing to these different readerships is to present a fascinating topic in an accessible and lucid manner which educates, entertains, and enthrals – exactly as medieval dragons themselves did.

Blurb:

The aim of this book is to explore the characteristics of the medieval dragon and discuss the different and sometimes differing views found in the relevant medieval text types. This study is based on an intimate knowledge of the primary texts and presents new interpretations of well-known literary works and also takes into consideration paintings and other depictions of these beasts. Dragons were designed not only to frighten, but also to fire the imagination, and provide a suitably huge and evil creature for the hero to overcome – yet there is far more to them than reptilian adversaries. This book introduces the medieval dragon via brief, accurate and clear chapters on its natural history, religion, literature and folklore, and concludes with how the dragon is constantly revived – from Beowulf to Tolkien, Disney and Potter.




Born into a traditional Welsh valley community, Paul Murphy has been a member of the Labour Party for more than 55 years. In this book, he describes how the socialist beliefs of that community, and of his parents especially, helped to develop his own very early political consciousness. After three years studying at Oxford, and alongside work as a lecturer in History and Government, he went on to serve on his local council before succeeding another mentor, Leo Abse, as MP for his home constituency Torfaen in 1987. His time in government from 1997 onwards included seven years as Secretary of State for Wales and for Northern Ireland, in the Cabinets of Tony Blair and Gordon Brown. The book provides unique insights into Murphy's leading role at times of major constitutional change, and of the pivotal part he played as Northern Ireland Minister under Mo Mowlam in negotiating the Good Friday Agreement.

Author Details:

Paul Murphy twice served as Welsh Secretary in the UK Government, first from 1999 to 2002 and secondly from 2008 to 2009. He also held the post of Northern Ireland Secretary in the Labour government between 2002 and 2005. He was MP for Torfaen from 1987 to 2015 and now sits in the House of Lords as Lord Murphy of Torfaen. His full title is The Right Honourable the Lord Murphy of Torfaen.






